This six-week, fully-online literacy leadership class is designed to provide educational leaders with knowledge and strategies to better support reading specialists, language arts educators, and literacy coaches for success in literacy instruction and leadership at the building and/or division level.

Assignments

Weekly Discussion Posts (6 total)

Students are expected to engage in weekly discussion posts that delve deeper into specific topics as outlined in each module. In addition, students must substantively respond to two peers. Discussion posts are worth **5 points** each.

Students are awarded one point for each:

- Submitted on-time
- Scholarly (reference any pertinent readings, additional research, etc.)
- Make personal/professional connections to the content
- Substantively respond to at least two peers' posts (more than "I agree" or "good point") x 2

Assessment Evaluation Analysis

Students will evaluate their current literacy assessments using an analysis tool (provided).

Literacy Leadership Image

Students will create an image to illustrate their literacy leadership philosophy, using readings, discussions, and learning from the class to inform their creative work.

Grading & Grading Scale

Weekly Discussion Posts (6 total)	50%
Assessment Evaluation Analysis	20%
Literacy Leadership Image	30%

Grading Scale: All non-credit classes are pass/fail. A minimum percentage of 80% is required to pass.
